BI 1349 <i>Holy Land Tour – Israel & Jordan</i> (elective) – 05/15/2010 – 05/25/2010, Dr. Dave Anderson (Not available as an online course).

*TH 2312 <i>Christology & Ecclesiology</i> – Mondays, 7:00–9:30pm, 01/11/2010 – 03/08/2010, Dr. Chris Moody A directed study of: (1) The doctrine of Christ, His full deity, sinless humanity, and His substitutionary atonement; (2) the hypostatic union; (3) the Church as the Body of Christ and its role and function in God's eternal plan.
*TH 2323 <i>Soteriology</i> – Mondays, 7:00–9:30pm, 03/29/2010 – 05/17/2010, Dr. Chris Moody A directed study of the doctrine of salvation including the work of Christ, the nature and extent of the atonement, the terms of salvation, election and human responsibility, and eternal security of the believer.

*MS 5320 <i>Spiritual Life</i> – Thursdays, 7:00–9:30pm, 03/25/2010 – 05/13/2010, Bob Thayer, Th.M. A directed study of the biblical principles that govern true Christian character and service, with emphasis on the sufficiency of the Scriptures and the yieldedness of the believer for holy living and spiritual effectiveness in ministry.
*BI 1351 <i>Daniel and Revelation</i> (elective) – Tuesdays, 7:00–9:30pm, 01/19/2010 – 03/09/2010, Dr. Dave Anderson A detailed survey, exposition and synthesis of the Old Testament book of Daniel and the New Testament book of Revelation, with an emphasis on the biblical theology, genre, and application of these two books. This course will include discussion of current events and recent history in light of end times prophecies.

*This course is a hybrid on-campus/on-line course for 3 credit hours in 8 weeks. There are eight 2.5-hour in-class/on-campus lectures and the remainder of the participatory time is on-line. This course may also be taken entirely on-line.

**This course is also offered for dual credit for students duly admitted to the College of Biblical Studies (CBS) and also duly admitted to Grace School of Theology (GSOT). To receive dual credit (3 bachelors level credit hours from CBS and 3 masters level credit hours from GSOT) you must register and pay tuition and fees for both the CBS course and the GSOT course, and you must complete extra work for the GSOT masters level credit. CBS financial aid is not available for GSOT tuition or fees.

North Houston (The Woodlands) Campus
*BI 1338 <i>NT Survey – Hebrews, General Epistles & Revelation</i> – Mondays, 7:00–9:30pm, 02/08/2010 – 05/10/2010, Dr. Charlie Bing. A survey and exposition of the New Testament books of Hebrews, James, 1 & 2 Peter, Jude, and Revelation, with an emphasis on the biblical theology of these books, their genre, and their application.
MS 5320 <i>Spiritual Life</i> – Tuesdays, 7:00–9:30pm, 01/19/2010 – 05/04/2010, Dr. Steven Wright A directed study of the biblical principles that govern true Christian character and service, with emphasis on the sufficiency of the Scriptures and the yieldedness of the believer for holy living and spiritual effectiveness in ministry.
*TH 2335 <i>Angelology, Anthropology & Hamartiology</i> – Thursdays, 7:00–9:30pm, 01/28/2010 – 03/11/2010, Dr. J.B. Hixson. A directed study of angelology (the doctrines of unfallen angels, Satan and the fallen angels); anthropology (creation of humanity, the material and immaterial aspects of humanity, and the fall of humanity); and hamartiology (original and personal sin).
*TH 2347 <i>Church History</i> – Thursdays, 7:00–9:30pm, 04/15/2010 – 05/20/2010, (two Monday classes: May 10 th and May 24 th) Scholl, PHD ABD. A directed overview and study of the history of the Christian church. This course traces the history of the church from its foundation to the present, with a focus on significant leaders and events.
